Order for Blessing a Married Couple Outside of Mass

The *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* provides an order for blessing a married couple within Mass on the anniversary of marriage.

Outside of Mass

Unlike the previous ritual book, the new ritual book does not provide an option for blessing married couples outside of Mass. What follows is an order for blessing married couples outside of Mass based on the order for this celebration from *The Book of Blessings* adapted to reflect the theology and texts of the new ritual book.

Although the readings for the celebration may be chosen from the *The Order of Celebrating Matrimony*, it should be remembered that the celebration is a blessing and not a re-enactment of the wedding. The structure of a blessing liturgy includes a reading of the Word of God and may include a psalm but it should not reflect a lengthier liturgy of the Word as we have for Sunday and feast day Masses or for other Sacraments.

Blessing Rather than Renewal of Vows

It is important to note that unlike the previous ritual, the new ritual does not allow for an explicit reiteration of promises or vows. Since the consent is permanent by design and does not bear repeating, the renewal of commitment takes place in silence or employs a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings and a prayer for God's help in remaining faithful to the promises already made.

Rings

The couple may have their rings blessed but the rings are not bestowed again. There is also an option for blessing new rings but again, there is no text for bestowing these rings). Rather than blessing the rings with holy water, the rings may be honoured with incense.

Occasions other than Anniversaries

In our diocese, many pastors find it pastorally fruitful to bless married couples on occasions other than anniversaries, especially as part of gatherings of numerous couples for retreat and reflection. Where the ritual speaks explicitly about anniversary, the presider can adapt the text to suit the occasion.

BLESSING OF MARRIED COUPLES OUTSIDE OF MASS

This order may be used by a priest or deacon. It could be be adapted for use by a layperson, who follows the rites and prayers designated for a lay minister in the *Book of Blessings*. The reading and psalm may be taken from those listed in no. 273 of *The Order of Celebrating Matrimony*. The reading may be found in the *Ritual Lectionary*, *The Order of Celebrating Matrimony*, or in the Sunday or weekday lectionary.

GATHERING HYMN

Hear our prayers for the married couples assembled here today. May their lives always bear witness to the reality of that love and become a sign of your presence for us today.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Presider: My dear friends,

Both: Blessed are you, Lord,

for in the good and the bad times of our life

you have stood lovingly by our side.

Help us, we pray,

to remain faithful in our love for one another,

so that we may be true witnesses

to the covenant you have made with humankind.

Presider: May the Lord keep you safe all the days of your life.

May he be your comfort in adversity

and your support in prosperity.

May he fill your home with his blessings.

Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

BLESSING OF RINGSII

Couples may be invited to remove their rings or hold the hand with the ring out for blessing:

Presider: Increase and sanctify, Lord,

the love of your servants,

who once gave each other these rings

as a sign of faithfulness,

that they may always grow

in the grace of the Sacrament.

Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The rings may be honoured with an incensation. If new rings are presented, see no. 279 in The Order of Celebrating Matrimony.

The couples may also be invited to kiss.

Presider: Husbands and wives, you may further express your

commitment and love with a kiss.

The intercessions may be adapted to the occasion.

Presider: Let us call upon the mercy of God the almighty Father.
