Dear Reverend Fathers, Pastoral Council Chairs, and Parish Finance Council Chairs,

The war in Ukraine continues to force many Ukrainians to flee their homes in seeking safety, protection, and assistance. Since February 24, 2022, over 5 million refugees have fled Ukraine, and those who remain in Ukraine will be in need of our support.

The Government of Canada has recently put in new measures to help those affected by the war in Ukraine. Ukrainian refugees can be sponsored to Canada by relatives or they can apply for a special temporary visitor visa that offers them the ability to work and study in Canada for up to three years.

In collaboration with Calgary Catholic Immigration Services (CCIS), we invite the Catholic faithful and parish communities in our Diocese to be in solidarity with our Ukrainian brothers and sisters and to consider offering assistance in one of the following ways:

1. Donate to the Emergency Funds for Ukraine

2. Donate directly to CCIS to help with resettlement in Calgary

3. Parish supporting a Ukrainian Family

Similar to the Syrian refugee program in 2015, parishes are now able to support a Ukrainian family. The screening will be done directly through CCIS, with sponsorship ranging from 3 months to 1 year. The Diocese of Calgary will subsidize participating parishes up to \$5,000 from the Pastoral Fund. For sponsorship please complete the initial Form available here.
